Bulletin #42 (English #22) - April/2026

Introduction

This is the Monthly Bulletin of the Paris Agreement Monitor, which tracks the key developments in the Paris Agreement negotiation process, including meetings, workshops, official statements, submission deadlines, and document publications. The reported developments are those that occurred up until the last day of the reference month.

*The Bulletin presents **retrospective updates** related to the previous month, and **future updates** concerning the current month, based on the publication of documents and event schedules available on the official agendas of the UNFCCC website. It also includes open deadlines and document submissions by the Parties and UNFCCC bodies.*

The developments are categorized according to the main thematic pillars of the Paris Agreement negotiations: Mitigation, Adaptation, Loss and Damage, Carbon Markets and Article 6 Cooperation Instruments, Finance, Forests, Gender, Transparency, Global Stocktake, Compliance, Technical Capacity-Building, Response Measures, Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples, Action for Climate Empowerment, Research, Technology, and Just Transition. For issues concerning the entire negotiation process and the UNFCCC system, we use the General category.

At the end of the edition, you will find a glossary with the most frequently used terms in the document.

The updates are reported in a way that describes the events and their relevance in the negotiation process. For more in-depth information on the content of the discussions at each described event, you can access the links provided in the updates. The links refer to the original transcript of the mentioned documents, meeting agendas and minutes, submitted documents, event recordings, referred technical reports, and official event web pages. All disclosed information is official and obtained through the UNFCCC website.

Glossary

ACE: Action for Climate Empowerment (ACE) is a term adopted by the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) to refer to the work carried out under Article 6 of the Convention and Article 12 of the Paris Agreement.

AC: Adaptation Committee (AC). A body established under the UNFCCC to promote the coherent implementation of adaptation by providing technical guidance, knowledge sharing, and support to Parties.

Paris Agreement: An international climate change treaty adopted in 2015 and in force since 2016. It is an implementation treaty linked to the UNFCCC.

AEP: The Accreditation Expert Panel supports the implementation of standards and procedures for the accreditation of operational entities involved in the validation and verification of projects and programmes of activities under the Article 6.4 mechanism, also known as the Paris Agreement Crediting Mechanism.

BAR: Baku Adaptation Roadmap (BAR). A structured process to advance the implementation of the Global Goal on Adaptation (GGA), including workshops and technical documents aimed at operationalizing adaptation.

BAV: Belém–Addis Vision (BAV). An initiative aimed at the technical and political operationalization of adaptation indicators, focusing on monitoring and evaluating progress toward the GGA.

CAF: National Registry of Family Farming (Cadastro Nacional da Agricultura Familiar).

CMA: Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement. It is the annual meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement to take decisions regarding the implementation of the treaty.

CMP: Conference of the Parties serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol. The decision-making body responsible for the implementation of the Kyoto Protocol.

COP: Conference of the Parties to the UNFCCC. It is the annual meeting of the Parties to the UNFCCC to take decisions regarding the implementation of the Convention.

DNAs: Designated National Authorities (DNAs). National entities responsible for approving and supervising the participation of projects in carbon market mechanisms, such as those under Article 6.

ETF: Enhanced Transparency Framework under the Paris Agreement.

FCAS: Fragile and Conflict-Affected States.

FMCP: Facilitative, Multilateral Consideration of Progress is a process under the Enhanced Transparency Framework of the Paris Agreement through which a facilitative and multilateral consideration is conducted regarding a Party's progress in relation to its efforts under Article 9 of the Paris Agreement and the implementation and achievement of its Nationally Determined Contribution.

GGA: Global Goal on Adaptation (GGA). A goal established under the Paris Agreement to enhance resilience and reduce vulnerability to climate change.

GIZ: Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit. A German international cooperation agency that supports sustainable development projects.

GST: Global Stocktake (GST). A periodic process under the Paris Agreement that assesses the collective progress of Parties toward achieving the Agreement's climate goals.

JTWP: Just Transition Work Programme (JTWP). An initiative under the UNFCCC to promote just transition pathways, focusing on the social, economic, and labor dimensions of climate action.

LT-LEDS: Long-Term Low Emission Development Strategies (LT-LEDS). National long-term plans aimed at decarbonization and climate-resilient development.

MDL: Clean Development Mechanism (CDM).

MEL: Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning (MEL). A systematic approach used to track results, assess impacts, and incorporate learning into policies and projects.

MEP: A panel that supports the development of standards and guidelines for emission reduction and removal activities, providing clarifications to facilitate the registration of these activities under the Article 6.4 mechanism of the Paris Agreement.

NAP: National Adaptation Plans (NAPs). Plans developed by countries, particularly Least Developed Countries (LDCs), to identify and address medium- and long-term climate change adaptation needs. These plans include strategies and programs aimed at increasing resilience to climate impacts.

NDC: Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC). An individual document submitted by Parties to the Paris Agreement outlining their contribution to limiting global temperature increase to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels and achieving the objectives of the Paris Agreement.

NWP: Nairobi Work Programme (NWP). An initiative under the UNFCCC aimed at improving knowledge and implementation of climate change adaptation.

PACM: Paris Agreement Crediting Mechanism (PACM). An instrument established under Article 6.4 to generate carbon credits from mitigation activities.

PAICC: Paris Agreement Implementation and Compliance Committee. A mechanism established under Article 15 of the Paris Agreement to facilitate implementation and promote compliance with its provisions.

Party(ies): country(ies) that are members of the UNFCCC and the Paris Agreement.

PNUD: United Nations Development Programme (UNDP).

PNUMA: United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP).

PRONAF: National Program for the Strengthening of Family Agriculture (Programa Nacional de Fortalecimento da Agricultura Familiar).

RCCs: Regional Collaboration Centres (RCCs). Structures supported by the UNFCCC to promote the implementation of climate policies and market mechanisms at the regional level.

SBI: Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI).

SBSTA: Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA).

SIDS: Small Island Developing States (SIDS). A group of countries particularly vulnerable to the impacts of climate change.

Stakeholders: state and non-state actors, public or private entities, whether accredited as “observers” to the UNFCCC system or not, that have an interest in the issues negotiated within the process.

Submission: a document through which an interested party presents its views on a specific negotiation topic, which may include technical and scientific contributions, as well as recommendations and concrete proposals on how that issue should be addressed and resolved among the Parties in the negotiations.

TEC: Technology Executive Committee (TEC).

TERRA: COP30 Action Agenda. A platform launched in the context of COP30 to promote climate solutions, including initiatives related to land use, bioeconomy, and sustainable production systems.

UNFCCC: United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), an international treaty adopted in 1992, of which the Paris Agreement forms part.

WIM: Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage (WIM). A UNFCCC framework aimed at addressing loss and damage associated with the impacts of climate change.

The 2015 Paris Agreement is an almost universally adopted international treaty with 193 member countries. It is linked to the UNFCCC, an overarching international treaty system that provides broader principles, guidelines, and policies for the global community to cooperatively address the climate crisis. One of the main goals of the Agreement is to prevent the global temperature from rising above 1.5°C or to keep it well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels—a threshold that science has shown to be a "point of no return" with devastating effects on life on Earth. Additionally, the Paris Agreement aims to make countries resilient to climate change and to decarbonize financial flows.
